#### Part B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The college strives to achieve excellence as an 'ideal' educational institution promoting all round development of the students who come from various sections of the society. The faculty motivates students to achieve distinction in academics by holding regular classes, tutorials, remedial classes and also by completion of the prescribed undergraduate syllabus in various courses well before the students appear at university examinations.

Students are encouraged to participate in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities within the college as well as in other institutions. They are also made aware of their social duties and responsibilities by organizing various outreach programmes through the NSS unit and the Social Service sub-committee of the college. The college has made efforts to provide career guidance and placement services to the interested students. The details of all activities are given in Part B of AQAR.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

No new academic programme could be initiated during 2010-11. However, the Governing Body in its meeting dated 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2011 has resolved to introduce three year Honours Course in Hindi w.e.f. 2012-13 session. Accordingly the affiliating university is being approached for approval for the said course.

## 3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction;

The College does not have freedom to introduce innovations in the undergraduate curricula prescribed by the affiliating Calcutta University. The faculty, however, introduce innovations in the transaction of their respective curriculum in accordance with the aptitudes and needs of their students. Students are taken for field visit to historical monuments and other places relevant to their particular subject(s) so that they can have a clear impression of what they read in text books. Play-reading and enacting in classrooms is resorted to by the department of English as an effective means of transaction of the U.G. curriculum in English literature.

No new inter-disciplinary programme has been started in 2010-11 session.

## 5. Examination reforms implemented:

The College has received financial assistance amounting to Rs 11, 671/- from the U.G.C. for examination reforms under XIth Plan allocation. Such reforms will be implemented soon within the guidelines prescribed by the U.G.C. and in accordance with the rules of the affiliating University.

Mr. Amit Sircar has been appointed as Typist vide G.O. no. 1139-UGC/5A-288 UGC-09 dt. 29/06/2011 of Directorate of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal.

Approval for engagement of 05 Part-Time teachers has been received vide G.O. No. 519 Edn(CS) dt. 30/06/2011 of the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal. These teachers (Ms. Atreyee Chakravarti, Ms. Jayita Bose, Ms. Vaswati Banerjee, Ms. Neelufar Khan, Ms. Sreyoshi Ghosh) initially appointed on college pay, shall henceforth be on Government pay with incremental benefits admissible upto the age of 60 years.

20. Teaching – Non-teaching staff ratio: 27:19

## 21. Improvements in the library services:

The improvements made in Library Services during 2010-11 are:

- A separate section of "New Additions" has been made for Fictional books to inculcate reading habit among the students.
- ii) A separate section for Reference Tools has been made where tools like Encyclopedia Britannica, Collins Encyclopedia, Encyclopedia of Social Science, Encyclopedia on Indian Literature, All Volumes on History by Winston S Churchill, etc are arranged and displayed for ready reference by the users.
- iii) New books have been purchased (details in serial no. 22).
- iv) A book exhibition-cum-sale was organized in college premises on 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2011 eight renowned publishers and book sellers participated.

# 22. New books / journals subscribed and their cost:

The library received books worth Rs. 1,98,322/- (Rupees one lakh ninety eight thousand three hundred twenty two) only purchased by the departments of English, Education, Geography, Political Science, Sociology, History, Economics, Philosophy, Communicative English, Journalism and Mass Communication and Fashion and Apparel Design, during the year. Subscription forms have been sent to publishers for delivery of the following journals – Artha Vijnana, Contribution to Sociology, Down to Earth, Economic and Political Weekly, Indian Economic and Social History Review and Vagarth.

The Merit Lists of candidates selected for admission to B.A./B.Sc./ B.FAD (1st year) have been uploaded on the college website within the stipulated time as directed by the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal as well as by the affiliating university.

### 27. Technology up-gradation:

The following equipments based on latest technology have been procured by utilizing the U.G.C. funds received under "Additional Assistance to Colleges" scheme during 2010-11.

- i) Purchase of computer-cum-projector (KYAN) worth Rs. 1 lakh as an effective teaching-learning aid in class rooms.
- ii) Purchase of document camera worth Rs. 51,459/- as an effective teaching-learning aid.

### 28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:

Teachers and students of the college have good access to computers and internet. Most of the teachers are well acquainted with use of computer and internet. For all students, the college jointly with Webel Informatics Ltd. offers a diploma course on PC application which includes fundamental operating systems, Microsoft office and business tool, Internet, C programming language. This course upgrades beginners to a techno-friendly enterprise environment.

#### 29. Financial aid to students:

Freeships amounting to a total of Rs. 21,315/- have been given to five students (one from 3<sup>rd</sup> year, two from 2<sup>nd</sup> year and two from 1<sup>st</sup> year) during 2010-11.

- 30. Support from the Alumni Association and its Activities:
- a) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association awarded The 'Highest Achiever Academic Medal' for achieving the highest aggregate among students of the college at the B.A. (Hons) final examination, 2010 of the University of Calcutta. The Alumni Association has been awarding this medal at the annual prize distribution ceremony of the college every year since 2006.
- b) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association organized a throw ball match between the alumni and the present students in March, 2011.
- c) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association organized 'Best Of Luck Party' for the students appearing at the B.A. final examination of the University of Calcutta in March, 2011.
- d) The Alumni Association undertook the task of beautification of the college lawn and presented the college with two saplings to commemorate the Golden Jubilee year of establishment of the College.
- 31. Support from the Parent-Teacher Association and its Activities:

The Parent-Teacher Association has not yet been formally established in the college. However, parents meet teachers regularly as the parent-teacher meetings are held in each session.

#### 32. Health services:

An awareness programme on Thalaseemia followed by Thalassemia test was organized by the college in association with the Rotary Club of Calcutta West on

March, 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 2011. A large number of students underwent blood test to ascertain whether they were Thalassemia carriers or not.

## 33. Performance in sports activities:

- (i) The Annual Sports was held on 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2011. Students, teachers and the non-teaching staff participated enthusiastically in the Throwing and Running events. Throwball and Badminton matches were also organized.
- (ii) The students (Priya Dasgupta, Saida Rahman, Sarita Upadhyay, Ayesha Firdaus, Maria Sabah, Hena Parveen, Sadma Begum) participated at the XIIth Inter Non-Govt. Athletic and Football Championship (Kolkata South District) held on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2011 at Rabindra Sarobar Stadium, hosted by Charuchandra College. The events in which our students participated were 100,200,400 meter Races, Long Jump, Shotput and Discus Throw.

## 34. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

# 35. Student achievements and awards:

### 36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling Cell:

The focus has been on Career Counselling. Ms. Anindita Sen has been appointed as full-time contractual teacher on college pay and has been given the charge of running the Career Counselling Cell. Campus interview has been arranged by this Cell for the final year students of Communicative English on 30.07.2010. Excel Infocom Pvt. Ltd., conducted the interview for the post of English teacher for their training centres in Kolkata.

The Career Counselling Cell also arranged for interview of final year students (those interested for placement) by Tata Consultancy Services in March, 2011.

The Department of Fashion and Apparel Design has also provided effective guidance to the first outgoing batch of students for career opportunity in industry by maintaining linkages with various institutions and industry (details given in serial no. 37).

### 37. Placement services provided to students:

Final year students of Communicative English faced campus interview by Excel Infocom Pvt. Ltd. for placement as English faculty in their training centres in Kolkata. Swarnali Dutta was selected at this interview held on 30.07.2010.

Five students (Gunjan Mathur, Devika Pradhan, Divya Katyal, Saswati Banerjee and Tapolabdha Banerjee) were sent for interview at Calcutta University campus in March, 2011 for placement in Tata Consultancy Services. Tapolabdha Banerjee was selected for placement at TCS, Mumbai.

- 5. Career Counselling and Placement Services The college has made some progress with respect to Career Counselling and Placement Services to students during 2010-11 (the details are given in serial nos. 36 & 37). More comprehensive measures in this direction have been planned for 2011-12.

Rani Birla Girls' College has completed fifty years in July, 2011; The inauguration of Golden Jubilee celebration took place on 15.12.2010. The inaugural programme was graced by the presence of Hon'ble Minister, Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, the Registrar, Calcutta University and other dignitaries. A cultural programme was organized on the occasion in which students and teachers participated. The college premises was the venue for this programme organized solely with the talent of its own students and staff.

## Part C: Detail the plans of the institution for the next year.

The departments have submitted the proposed plan of departmental activities during 2011-12 to the IQAC cell in the proforma provided for the purpose by the cell. All the 12 departments of the college will hold departmental seminars (at least one per department) during 2011-12 by utilizing the funds allocated for the purpose in the annual budget of the college (Rs. 2000/- per department).

An interdisciplinary national level seminar on "Dr. Ramvilas Sharma: Srijan - Samvad" will be organized by the college in February, 2012 in collaboration with the Goenka College of Commerce and Business Administration, Kolkata. The U.G.C. has sanctioned Rs.93,750/- for the seminar.

An interdisciplinary state level seminar "Interrogating Globalization And The Changing Face Of India" will be organized by the college in March, 2012 in

collaboration with the Institute of Civil Service Aspirants, Salt Lake, Kolkata. The U.G.C. has sanctioned Rs. 60,000/- for this seminar.

A workshop on the U.G. syllabus on Education Honours will be organized by the college in December, 2011 in collaboration with the Department of Education, Calcutta University. The U.G.C. has sanctioned Rs. 37,500/- for the same.

Automation of library services using SOUL software will be completed during 2011-12. Plans for expansion of reading room capacity for students in the college library will be implemented during the year.

The Career Counselling cell has planned to introduce Preparatory Training for Govt. Service Entry Level Examinations for final year students by utilizing U.G.C. funds sanctioned for this purpose. Counselling of students for career opportunities through one-to-one interaction with professional counsellors have also been planned for final year students during 2011-12.

The NSS unit of the college has planned various programmes to be organized during Youth Week in January, 2012. These programmes will include awareness camps on various social and health related issues as well as outreach programmes for serving the less privileged neighbourhood community in slums.

The Gender Sensitization and Awareness Against Sexual Harassment Cell of the college has planned to undertake extension activity in association with NGOs working on poor, homeless and mentally ill women in the streets of Kolkata.

Development programmes for the staff will be organized during 2011-12. A basic computer training course for Group –D employees of the college has been planned during the summer recess in 2012. Workshops on Organizational Behavior will be held during 2011-12. The non-teaching staff will be encouraged to participate in U.G.C. sponsored workshops organized by other colleges during the year.
