












Image 6 and 7: Photos of the Workshop at Lady Brabourne College




Image 9 and 10. Sample Question Paper of Final Assessment




Image 5. Notice of the Educational Visit to Indian Museum




Image 6 to 8: Photos of the Visit




Image 10. Report of the Visit




Image 11. Notice for Final Assignment of the Course




Image 12. Sample Question Papper of the Final Assignment of the Course




