
Minutes of the meeting held on 25th February 2020 at 11am in the library:

Memorandum of Understanding

- I. **Parties:**
The parties of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are Rani Birla Girls' College, Kolkata – 700017, and Foundation of Unified Youths of Gayeshpur, P.O. Gayeshpur, Kalyani, Nadia, hereafter collectively referred to as the Parties.
- II. **Purpose:**
The purpose of this agreement is to establish roles and responsibilities for the Parties to develop and implement a collaborative relationship in various social-service activities and welfare programs. It is the shared interest of both the parties to support socially productive activities. Both parties, therefore, agree to foster collaboration and work towards the common goal of societal welfare.

III. Statement of Work/ Roles and Responsibilities:

- a. The Foundation of Unified Youths of Gayeshpur will share their annual activity schedule/program calendar, which would include details of activities that they will carry out during the entire year.
- b. Staff members and students of Rani Birla Girls' College will actively participate in several socially productive activities/ welfare programs organized by the Foundation of Unified Youths of Gayeshpur permitting that the activities are feasible, keeping in consideration the distance and the academic schedules of the students/staff members of Rani Birla Girls' College.
- c. The students/staff members of Rani Birla Girls' College will organize drives to collect donations in the form of clothes, school items, toys, and other useful objects that can be distributed through Foundation of Unified Youths.
- d. The students/staff members of Rani Birla Girls' College will also try to participate in different 'social cause' drives and activities like 'Tree Plantation' and social activity camps.

IV. Tenure and Termination:

This MOU will take effect from the date it is signed by the representatives of the two parties. It will remain valid for one year and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and agreement from both parties. This MOU may only be modified or amended in writing upon the written request of either party and the concurrence of the other party. Either party may terminate the MOU by giving written notice to the other party one month in advance.

This agreement does not cause or imply any transfer of funds or financial commitment between the signatories.

Once terminated neither party will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other party may suffer.

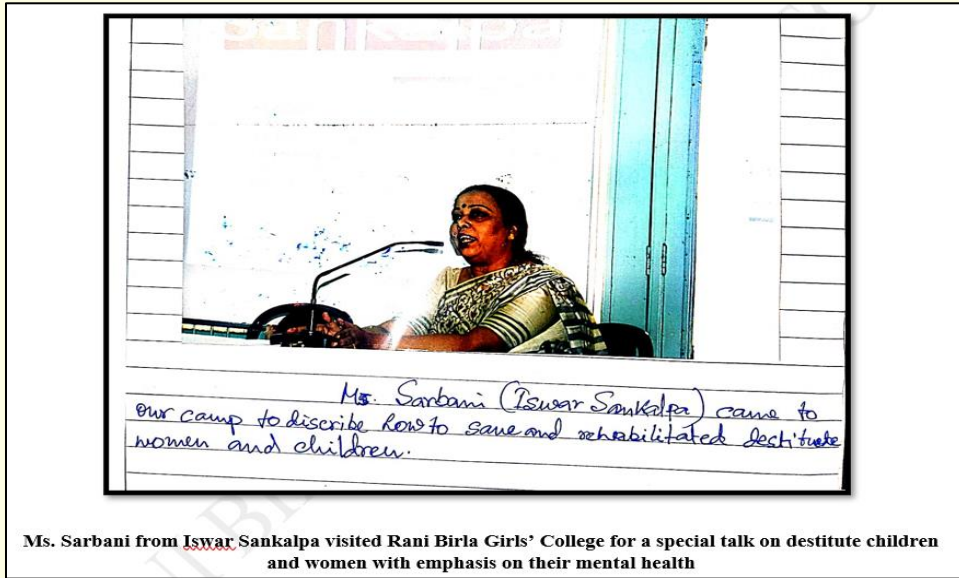

Initiatives for Women's Empowerment

Objectives:

Rani Birla Girls' College is committed to imparting higher education to women so as to empower them through academic accomplishments and gainful employment. Additionally, it promotes a holistic development of students so as to produce confident women who are capable of holding their own in any situation. In view of these, the college's initiatives for women's empowerment, have the following objectives:

- to motivate students to pursue studies beyond graduation;
- to instil the ethic of economic independence, particularly, the spirit of entrepreneurship, so that students will be "job-creators" rather than "job-seekers";
- to promote a culture of respect and equality for women;
- to ensure that sexual harassment is treated as an unacceptable social behaviour on campus and in society;
- to prioritize women's health and well-being;
- to take the agenda of women's empowerment beyond campus, by supporting the cause of socio-economically disadvantaged women.

The Context:

The principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution. Accordingly, the National Education Policy (2020) envisions an equitable access by women to quality education in order to enhance their employability. It also emphasizes a gender-sensitive institutional environment with complaint redressal mechanisms, and measures to safeguard women's health. The constitutional mandate, the NEP's guidelines and, over and above these, the college's enlightened dedication to its vision-mission as an institution of higher education for women – all these constitute the context for the college's initiatives for women's empowerment.

The Practice:

Women's empowerment is translated into a pre-eminent practice by the college's initiatives in the following areas:

1. Motivating students to pursue post-graduate education and/or gainful employment

- The Career Counselling Sub-committee organized seminars, lectures and workshops to alert students to opportunities of A. post-graduate studies and government incentives and scholarships for the same; B. vocational training and associated employment options.
- Entrepreneurship skills were promoted. Add-on Courses (e.g. on making fashion accessories, clothes etc.) were designed to enhance the employability potential of students. Articles produced by the students were exhibited for sale. At the College Fete and Book Fair, students set up stalls to sell food and handicrafts, which they made.

2. Enforcing gender equity on campus through administrative mechanisms

- Statutory bodies were formed (according to UGC Regulations) to address gender-related grievances of students, faculty and staff. These include an Internal Complaints Committee, a Grievance Redressal Cell and an Anti-ragging Cell. Information regarding the constitution and objectives of these statutory bodies is displayed in the college website and stated in the College Brochure.
- A 'Women's Development Cell' was formed to provide an exclusive forum for discussion of women-centric issues and welfare projects for women.
- A Gender Audit was conducted by the college to assess the extent to which gender parity is effectively institutionalized in the college's policies, curricular and co-curricular programmes and organizational structure. The objective was to identify and rectify any existing lacunae in such matters.

3. Designing co-curricular activities to reiterate the spirit of women's empowerment

- International Women's Day and Kanyasree Day were commemorated with a range of activities for students, e.g., a debate competition on "Women in the Military: A True Step Towards Gender Equality", and a photography competition on "Aajker Nandini" (The Contemporary Woman).
- Students' seminars were held, e.g., on "Women Revolutionaries in Colonial Bengal" which highlighted the contribution of women nationalists like Matangini Hazra and Bina Das to India's struggle for independence.
- Special lectures were arranged, e.g., on "Legal Awareness for Women", which discussed ways and means of redressal under the IPC, for domestic violence, sexual harassment etc.
- Films on women's issues were screened, e.g., "Suffragette", a film on the history of struggle by women to gain voting rights.

4. Prioritizing women's health and well-being

- The college offers regular, free-of-cost access to a female doctor and two certified female psychological counsellors, on campus. This enables students, in particular, to freely discuss their health issues and seek advice.
- For all women stakeholders on campus, the college provides facilities such as separate washrooms; a sanitary napkin dispensing machine and incinerator; security guards at the main gate, 24x7. There is, also, CCTV surveillance of the campus, 24x7.
- Training in techniques of self-defence is provided to students, as an exercise in physical and psychological empowerment. Such training was imparted under the Sukanya

Project, an initiative of the Kolkata Police, in collaboration with the Women and Child Development and Social Welfare Department, Government of West Bengal.

- Awareness programmes on various aspects of women's health and well-being were organized in college, e.g., on menstrual hygiene, women-specific cancers, nutritional deficiencies in women etc.

5. Supporting the cause of marginalized/underprivileged women in society

- To take its agenda of women's empowerment beyond campus, the college has signed Memoranda of Understanding with two NGOs (Ankur Kala and Iswar Sankalpa), which work for socio-economically disadvantaged women. In collaboration with these, the College arranged outreach activities, e.g., donation drives for destitute women and on-campus exhibition and sale of food and handicrafts produced by women in the care of these NGOs.
- Mrs. Sarbani Das Roy, founder of Iswar Sankalpa, was invited to address all stakeholders on the protocols for rehabilitation of destitute women and children. The aim was to raise awareness among students on these issues.

Evidence of Success:

That the college's initiatives to create a campus-environment where women feel safe, supported, and empowered to excel in their academic and professional pursuits, have borne fruit is evidenced in: A. the fact that there has been no reported case of infringement of women's rights and dignity on campus, till date; b. a sizable number of students have proceeded onto post-graduate studies in various disciplines and have secured gainful employment, after graduation.

Problems encountered and resources required:

Implementation of the session-wise plans and their monitoring have become a tough task in view of the tight academic schedule. Also, due to limitations imposed by the pandemic situation, several initiatives had to be abandoned. The college recognizes that more funds would qualitatively enhance its initiatives for women's empowerment.

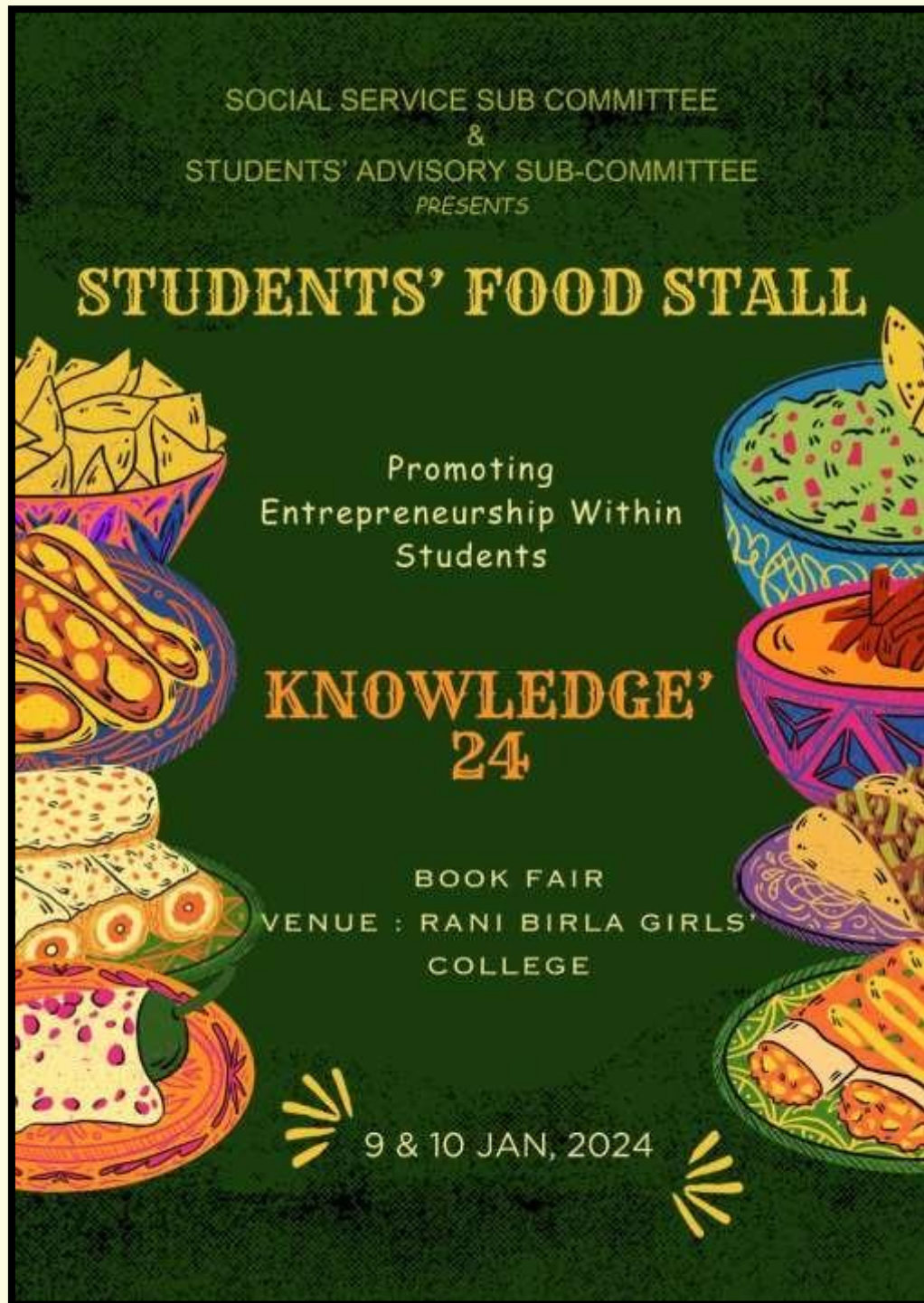

PRINCIPAL'S ROOM

Minutes of the Meeting held on 28/04/23

Meeting started with extending warm welcome to all the members.

Item - 1

To prevent, prohibit and redress the Sexual Harassment of women employees and students in College the ICC recommended the following policies in consonance with the gazette notification of UGC, of 2015.

- To commit to zero-tolerance policy towards sexual Harassment.
- To reinforce the commitment to creating the Campus free from discrimination, harassment, retaliation or sexual assault at all levels.
- To display prominently at conspicuous places the penalty and consequences of Sexual Harassment.
- To inform employees and students of the recourse available to them if they are victim of sexual Harassment.
- To treat Sexual Harassment as a misconduct under Service Rules and initiate actions for misconduct forwarding the matter to the competent authority if the perpetrator is an employee.
- To treat the Sexual Harassment as a violation of disciplinary rules leading upto suspension and expulsion if the perpetrator is a student.
- To prepare an annual status report with details on the number of cases filed and their disposal and submit the same to the UGC.

Item - 2

To curb all forms of sexual Harassment of employees and students the ICC is -

- To provide mechanisms of dispute redressal and dialogue to anticipate and address issues through just and fair conciliation without undermining complainant's rights and minimize the need for purely punitive approaches that lead to further resentment, alienation or violence.
- To protect the safety of the complainant by non-divulging the person's identity and provide the mandatory relief by way of sanctioned leave or relaxation of attendance forwarding the matter to the competent authority for approval of the same.

To ensure that victims or witnesses are not victimized or discriminated against while dealing with complaints of Sexual Harassment.

- To ensure prohibition of retaliation or adverse action against a covered individual because the employee or the student is engaged in protected activity.

As regards the process of filing complaint the committee discussed and consented to the policies of Gazette Notification dt. May, 2016 which are as follows:-

- An aggrieved person is required to submit a written (legible hand writing) or typed on paper to the ICC within 3 months from the date of the incident and in case of a series of incidents within a period of 3 months from the date of the last incident.
Provided that where such complaint can not be made in writing, the Presiding Officer or any member of the ICC shall render all reasonable assistance to the person for making complaint in writing with the help of the audio recording of the complainant.
Provided further that the ICC may, for the reasons to be accorded in the writing, extend the time limit not exceeding 3 months, if it is satisfied that the circumstances were such which prevented the person from filing a complaint with the said period.
- Nature of Complaint should be clearly stated in details with dates and locations and must be in no case anonymous.
- Friends, relatives, colleagues, Co-students, Psychologist, or any other associate of the victim may file complaint in situation where the aggrieved person is unable to make complaint on account of physical or mental incapacity or death.
- The written complaint is to be sent to the receiving section (office).
- All complaints will be dealt with confidentially.
- Only matters pertaining to sexual harassment and/or discrimination of staff and students will be under the jurisdiction of the ICC.

Regarding the process of conducting enquiry the com. discussed and consented to the policies of the Gazette Notification, dt. May 2016 which are as follows:-

- a) The ICC shall, upon the receipt of the complaint, send 1 copy of complaint to the respondent with in a period of 7 days of such receipt.
- b) Upon receipt of the copy of the complaint, the respondent shall file his or her reply to the complaint along with the list of documents, and names and addresses of witnesses within a period of 10 days.
- c) The enquiry has to be completed with in a period of 90 days from the receipt of the complaint. The enquiry report with recommendation has to be submitted

within 10 days from the completion of the enquiry to the Executive Authority of the Institution. Copy of the findings or recommendation shall also be served on both parties to the complaint.


- a) The Executive Authority of the HEI shall act on the recommendation of the committee within a period of 30 days from the receipt of the enquiry report unless an appeal against the findings is filed within that time by either party.
- a) An appeal against the findings of the ICC may be filed by either party before the Executive Authority of the HEI with in period of 30 days from the date of recommendation.
- b) If the Executive Authority of the HEI decides not to act as per the recommendation of the ICC, then it shall records written reasons for the same to be conveyed to the ICC and both the parties to the proceedings. If it is decided to act as per the recommendation of the ICC, then a show cause notice, answerable within 10 days shall be served on the party against whom actions is decided to be taken. The Executive Authority of the HEI shall proceed only after considering the reply of the aggrieved person.
- a) Aggrieved party may seek conciliation in order to settle the matter. No monetary settlement should be made as a basis of conciliation.

Punishment :-

1. Anyone found guilty of sexual harassment shall be punished in accordance with the service rules of the HEI, if the offender is an employee.
2. Where the respondent is a student, depending upon the severity of the offence, the HEI may:-
 - a. Withhold privileges of the student such as access to the library, auditoria, scholarships, allowances, and identity card.
 - b. Suspend or restrict entry into the campus for a specific period.
 - c. Expel and strike off name from the rolls of the institution, including denial of readmission, if the offence warrants.
 - d. Award reformative punishments like mandatory counselling and, or, performance of community services.

Action against frivolous complaint - To ensure that the provisions for the protection of employees and students from sexual harassment do not get misused, provisions against false or malicious complaints have to be made and publicized within the institutions.
